

Teacher Checklist for Administering Cat5 Tests

1.	Beg	in Here:	
		Check your email for a <i>Cat5 invitation</i> (sent from <u>Noreply@cat5edition.com</u> ; check spam/junk) Click Sign In to access the Teacher Dashboard (bookmark this log-in page)	
		Go to My Account to change password Check the Master List for accuracy by clicking the pencil icon beside the student's name to view	
		student information (name, grade, ID#, and D.O.B.) and specify Special Groups , if board permits Under student information, exempt any student you believe can not validly engage in the testing Click the Add Student button to <u>add</u> and trash can icon to <u>remove</u> a student from the Master List	
2.	Beto	re Creating a Test Session: Check devices are fully charged and ready to use for the entire session Ensure enough headphones for all students in Grades K-3 (spring), K-4 (fall)	
		(adjust the volume for students on laptops as volume buttons are locked in the Secure Browser) Check internet connection/bandwidth for any potential issues or disruptions	
		Ensure students have blank pencil and paper available for the Mathematics subtests.	
3. Administer a Test Session:			
		In the Teacher Dashboard, click on Create A Session and select subtests to administer Ensure that subtests you choose can be grouped, otherwise create separate sessions (see <i>Reminders</i>)	
		Check email for <i>New Session passcode</i> (flag for reference)	
		Ensure all students have a device (and headphones, if required) that is ready to use Write the Session passcode where all students can see (e.g. on the white/black board)	
		Ensure that students can locate the <i>Cat5 Secure Browser</i> on their device to begin the test	
4. Monitor the Testing:			
		In the Session Details page, check all students required to do the test have Logged in Click on the Refresh button often to get updated information on student test activity	
		If a warning of inactivity appears beside a student's name, check if they need assistance	
		Remind students to double-check they've completed all test questions before submitting (clicking the I'm Finished button means they're submitting the test for scoring)	
5. Control the Testing:			
		Students in Grades K-3 are permitted multiple test sittings; to manage test sittings, click the Pause Session button to allow breaks between each test sitting (test is auto-paused and saved once student selects "Next"	
		[>] button) *Note: the teacher determines the length of each sitting and the breaks between sittings	
		To resume the test session again, click Resume Session to allow all students access to the test interface and they can continue doing the test, without logging in again	
		To log out all students from the testing, click on the Log Out for All button (students must select "Next" [>] button on the test page, to auto-save and automatically log them out)	
		To give access to all students again after logging them all out, select the Give Access to All button	
		To log out or give access to individual students, select the subtest to the right of the student's name (in the Logged In category) and select the Log Out button and then later Give Access (in Not Logged In)	
6. After the Testing:			
		To invalidate a test score, select the subtest to the right of a student's name and under Invalidation Options select the subtest and reason	
		On the Cat5 homepage, click on Email My Reports to get immediate access to student test records	
		Check Email for two versions of the reports – PDF (save onto computer) or Webpage (view online) Complete a voluntary questionnaire at the end of the testing period for CTC feedback	



Reminders for Administering Cat5 Tests

Teachers are not permitted to preview the tests		
Teachers do not have to do any special preparation for the test, as it should be a review for the students		
Internet connection/bandwidth limitations that may hinder video instruction streaming (Gr. K-3):		
 If you anticipate any potential issues that may disrupt video instruction streaming for your students, 		
you may want to play the video for the whole class before you allow them to log in to a test session		
(sign in to a subtest as one of the students and project the video using a projector/Smartboard)		
 If you have already shown the video instructions, ask students to skip through to the sample questions 		
once they log in to the test themselves.		
Once a student selects I'm Finished on their test, they will not be able to login again (the system will begin		
scoring and students are not able to revisit the test)		
Passcodes are valid once <u>any student</u> uses it to log-in for a session (passcodes are valid until 4 pm EST that day)		
An Inactivity Warning will show up in red beside a student's name when they have been stuck on a question for		
more than 6 minutes; check if they require assistance (remind them they can skip and return to questions after)		
Invalidations:		
o Students who were invalidated for a subtest, will have a red dot with a dash in a file icon beside their name		
 Instead of a score on their records, it will show up as "IN" on their report 		
Exemptions:		
 Students who are exempted before testing begins, they will not have a test record 		
 Students who were exempted after testing begins and submits the test, their test record will show 		
an "E" on their report (we suggest you exempt students prior to creating test sessions)		
For Elementary (Grades K-8) Mathematics:		
 Create separate test sessions for: Mathematics, Real-World Math and Computation & Estimation 		
(no calculators are permitted for Computation & Estimation, only scrap paper may be provided)		
 For Mathematics and Real-World Math, a physical calculator and scrap paper may be provided 		
For Secondary (Grades 10-12) Mathematics:		
 Create separate sessions for Academic and Applied Mathematics classes 		
 Calculators and scap paper are permitted for both Academic and Applied Mathematics 		
For this study:		
 No accommodations will be permitted (including: dictionaries, translators, formula sheets etc) 		
 Try to avoid exemptions, if possible 		
Spring Testing Window		
o <u>Elementary</u> : March 1 st – June 30 th		
 Secondary (or semestered): May 1st – June 30th 		
Fall Testing Window		
o <u>Elementary</u> : September 1 st – November 30 th		
 Secondary (or semestered): September 1st – October 31st
